RESOLUTION NO. 27 Adopt Local Law No. 2 of 2017 – Update Chapter

164 "Taxation" in the Sweden Town Code – Addition of Article Entitled "Solar, Wind Energy

and Farm Waste Energy Systems"

WHEREAS, Section 487 of the Real Property Tax Law allows for Solar or Wind Energy Systems or Farm Waste Energy Systems to be eligible for a 15-year exemption

from taxation to the extent of any increase in assessed value due to such systems; and

- WHEREAS, New York State Real Property Tax Law § 487 also allows for municipalities to elect by local law to disallow such exemptions from taxation effective as of the date of adoption of such local law; and
- WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Sweden desires to enact a local law to disallow such exemptions; and
- WHEREAS, a duly advertised Public Hearing was held by the Town Board at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York, on February 7, 2017, at 7:00 PM., to hear all persons interested in the adoption of Local Law No. 2 of 2017 Update to Chapter 164 "Taxation" in the Sweden Town Code Addition of Article Entitled "Solar, Wind Energy and Farm Waste Energy Systems"; and

WHEREAS, all persons desiring to be heard were heard and due deliberation having been had.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Sec. 1. That Local Law No. 2 of 2017 reads as follows:

## § 164-Article VII Solar, Wind Energy and Farm Waste Energy Systems

This article is adopted pursuant to the Authority of Real Property Tax Law § 487 which allows for the adoption of a Local Law providing that the provisions of §487 of the Real Property Tax Law allowing for exemptions from taxation to the extent of any increase in assessed value due to the construction of such systems shall not apply to any such systems constructed within the Town of Sweden after the effective date of this Article.

- Sec. 2. That the Town Board of the Town of Sweden hereby adopts Local Law No. 2 of 2017 Updates to Chapter 164 "Taxation" in the Sweden Town Code Addition of Article Entitled "Solar, Wind Energy and Farm Waste Energy Systems".
