The complex will have one access point off of Owens Road, two-story apartment buildings with storage areas on the ground floor, patio and balcony options, clubhouse community center with internet access, visitor parking, small playground, laundry facilities, service provider on site for Lifetime Assistance residents and a maintenance manager on site. They feel the project fits in with the area and are asking to extend the Retail Commercial zoning that is currently in place on the neighboring parcel to the south.
