A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Sweden was held at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York, on Saturday, January 12, 2008.

Town Board members present were Supervisor Buddy Lester, Councilperson Rob Carges, Councilperson Patricia Connors, Councilperson Tom Ferris and Councilperson Danielle Windus-Cook. Also present were Director of Finance Leisa Strabel, Superintendent of Highways Fred Perrine, Director of Buildings and Grounds Jeremy Oakden and Town Clerk Karen Sweeting.

Visitors present were residents Jim Hamlin, Martin Weezorak, Donald Hibsch, Marilyn Lafferty, Mark Rabjohn, Manmadharao Kasaraneni, Linda and Francisco Borrayo and Village Board Trustee Connie Castaneda. Members of BISCO: Rob Blair, President; Robert Reusch representing Kiwanis; Roger Smith representing the Brockport Fire Department; A. Gary Zimmer representing Rotary; Kelly Smith representing Lakeside Foundation; and Greg Lund representing Lions. Also present reporter Mike Costanza from the Spencerport Hilton Post. Resident Bob Canham arrived at 9:30 a.m.

Supervisor Lester called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and asked everyone present to say the Pledge to the Flag led by Roger Smith, member of BISCO and longtime member of the Brockport Fire Department.

Supervisor Lester opened by announcing that the Town Board is going to have four Saturday meetings in 2008 to accommodate those residents that work late or are busy with children's schedules, etc. Other Saturday meetings are scheduled for March, May and September. Saturday meetings replace the first Tuesday meeting of these selected months. Councilperson Connors is inviting county and state officials to attend the May 10, 2008 meeting to explain the water district formation process and the "hurdles" and "obstacles" involved.

Supervisor Lester welcomed the members from BISCO. BISCO has made generous contributions to the town in the past – the Skate Park was constructed using monies donated by BISCO. Supervisor Lester met with BISCO to discuss another joint venture – the baseball field at the Sweden Town Park. Mr. Lester introduced the President of BISCO, Rob Blair.

Mr. Blair was pleased to see the baseball field coming along. The field will provide an opportunity for older kids as well as adults to play on a regulation size field. Mr. Blair, on behalf of BISCO, presented the Town of Sweden with a check for \$10,000 for batting cages, bleachers and a pitching machine. Local service clubs have been approached for additional monies for the construction of fencing to protect the dugout areas.

Supervisor Lester acknowledged the remaining visitors and asked if anyone would like to speak.

Resident Francisco Borrayo thanked the Board for holding Saturday meetings. Mr. Borrayo appreciates the opportunity to participate and hopes the Board will continue to hold Saturday meetings periodically.

Resident Martin Weezorak asked who could be contacted regarding the money that taxpayers are spending to fund the court (referring to the *Snapshots* issue Winter 2007/2008 message from the Supervisor's office relative to the justice court). Mr. Weezorak was concerned that the state mandates the court system and the taxpayers of the Town of Sweden have to make up the costs not covered by the state. Mr. Weezorak didn't feel that was fair to the taxpayers.

Supervisor Lester explained that the state hands down many unfunded mandates to the towns. Legislation now allows towns to look into consolidation of neighboring courts. The Town of Sweden is open to ideas to cut costs and have already partnered with neighboring towns in several areas – recreation, library services, fire and ambulance. Mr. Lester added that the possibility of consolidation is not a reflection on the staff. The Sweden justices and clerks do a wonderful job, work long hours and have a tremendous caseload, but the Board should always consider ways to reduce the burden on local taxpayers.

Law No. 2 of 2008 – Addition of "Peddling and Soliciting" to the Sweden Town Code
