

At 7:15 p.m. Supervisor Milner called to order a public hearing located at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York on January 25, 2011. The purpose of the public hearing was for the presentation of testimony and documentary evidence, which will become part of a record regarding the historic, architectural or cultural importance of the proposed landmark at 1669 Reed Road.

Town Board Members present were Supervisor John Milner, Councilperson Robert Carges, Councilperson Patricia Connors, and Councilperson Rebecca Donohue. Councilperson Michael Myers was absent. Also present were Finance Director Leisa Strabel, Town Clerk Karen Sweeting, Landmarks Advisory Committee member Bill Andrews, Town Attorney Jim Bell and Superintendent of Highways Fred Perrine.

Visitors present were Chris LoMonaco and son Michael, Cora Schrader, Vesta Teeter, Jim Hamlin and Annie Crane.

Supervisor Milner asked Town Clerk Karen Sweeting to read the legal notice published in the Town newspaper. Notice was read.

Landmarks Advisory Committee member Bill Andrews stated the committee based its recommendation on two key points – architectural and historical importance of the house located at 1669 Reed Road. The structure is of well –preserved brick Italianate character built in 1854 with one addition.

The home was built by Asa Rowe, one of the first nurserymen in the area. Mr. Rowe also served as the Supervisor for the Town of Greece and later as the Supervisor for the Town of Sweden.

Mr. Andrews explained that the Landmark Advisory Committee is only concerned with the exterior of any structure designated as an historic landmark.

Supervisor Milner asked if there were any further comments. No further comments were made. The public hearing was closed at 7:30 pm.
