Councilperson Skoog read a prepared statement detailing the working relations between board members for the past several months and noted the recent change in communication, she felt, due to the upcoming elections. Mrs. Skoog expressed her appreciation for the work done by the Sweden Community Foundation and Senator Ortt in securing funds for the construction of a playground at the Town Park. She was disappointed that she was not invited to attend the ceremony. Mrs. Skoog hopes that communication will improve. (Full statement on file in the Town Clerk's office)

Resident Cathy White stated she has lived here for 50 plus years and is upset that Councilpersons Skoog and Rich were not included in the ceremony for the playground. She added that the Town Board represents the town, not just a particular political party.

Councilperson Muesebeck stated that his invitation came from Senator Ortt because he is a member of the Sweden Community Foundation. He has lived here for 71 years and has been very involved in the community and takes exception to allegations spoken at this meeting.

Councilperson Rich thanked the Sweden Community Foundation and Senator Ortt for the playground funds. She was also disappointed with the lack of communication and felt it was political and is affecting the work environment. (Full statement on file in the Town Clerk's office)
