

At 7:15 p.m. Supervisor Milner called to order a public hearing located at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York on December 14, 2010. The purpose of the public hearing was for the presentation of testimony and documentary evidence, which will become part of a record regarding the historic, architectural or cultural importance of the proposed landmark at 5137 Lake Road South.

Town Board Members present were Supervisor John Milner, Councilperson Robert Carges, Councilperson Patricia Connors, and Councilperson Michael Myers. Also present were Finance Director Leisa Strabel, Town Clerk Karen Sweeting, Landmarks Advisory Committee member Bill Andrews and Seasonal Recreation Director Ricki DeBaun.

Visitor present was Rebecca Donohue.

Supervisor Milner asked Town Clerk Karen Sweeting to read the legal notice published in the Town newspaper. Notice was read.

Landmarks Advisory Committee member Bill Andrews stated the committee based its recommendation on two key points – architectural and historical importance of the house located at 5137 Lake Road South. The south wing of the house was built in the 1820s and used as a settler's cabin. The north wing was added prior to 1830 and is of brick Greek revival style. The exterior of the home is virtually unchanged with the exception of the vinyl siding on the east façade.

The home has been owned by a number of prominent members of the community. Guy Chappell of whom Chappell Street is named, Israel Starks a deacon of the Baptist Church and Milo Starks a great Civil War hero.

Supervisor Milner asked if there were any further comments. No further comments were made. The public hearing was closed at 7:30 pm.
