REPORTS

Councilperson Carges reported that he received the maintenance contract renewal for the HVAC at the Community Center. He asked the remaining board members for permission to solicit other maintenance proposals – they agreed. Mr. Carges would provide the proposed figures at the next workshop. The current contract is good until the end of March and it wouldn't hurt to review the options every couple of years. The maintenance contract is currently with Monroe Piping.

Councilperson Connors reported that the Comprehensive Plan Committee has completed their updates and will hold a public hearing on April 5, 2005 at 7:00 pm.

Councilperson Windus-Cook reported that she attended the Route 531 meeting held on March 8, 2005. She felt that the meeting did not provide a lot of new information and that the studies would continue.

Supervisor Lester reported that he met with Wayne Zyra, Jack Milner, and Charlie Militello regarding the formation of a charitable, not-for-profit organization for the purpose of fundraising for community activities. Mr. Lester met with SUNY Brockport student, Mark Beckwith regarding a community service tree project. Mr. Beckwith stated that the Village of Brockport has put in \$2.00 per "head" to support this project and was asking the same from the Town of Sweden. Mr. Lester explained to Mr. Beckwith that he didn't feel the Town was in the position to do so at this time, but would monitor the progress of the Village. Mr. Lester reported that Gerald Dowd from Fourth Section Road would try to encourage his neighbors to sign the petition for the sewer district formation. He met with Mike Sentiff regarding trees which Sentiff alleges were damaged by the highway department in 1999. He explained that there may be issues relative to the statute of limitations and filing timely, but Fred Perrine would look into it. Mr. Lester attended the Supervisor's luncheon held on March 18th. Cheryl Dinolfo spoke at the luncheon regarding the possibility of expanding the DMV Mobile Unit into more Towns.

This determination constitutes a negative declaration for purposes of SEQR.

RESOLUTION NO. 41	Granting to the Town of Sweden a Drainage	

Easement for Property Located on Transit Way – <u>Parcel ID#084.01-1-1.119– Daniel C. Hogan</u>

WHEREAS: Daniel C. Hogan is desirous of granting to the Town of Sweden a permanent drainage easement at his property located on Transit Way – Parcel ID#084.01-1-1.119, legally described as follows:

Drainage Easement

RESOLUTION NO. <u>42</u>	Calling for Public Hearing Regarding Adoption of Local Law No. 1, 2005 – Amendment to the <u>Town of Sweden Dog Ordinance</u>

- WHEREAS, A recommendation has been made by the Sweden Dog Control Officer, Kathy Beaumont, that there is a need for an amendment to the Sweden Dog Ordinance; and
- WHEREAS, the recommendation is the addition of a definition of "dangerous dog" due to several attacks by dogs in the Town of Sweden on other dogs and cats; and
- WHEREAS, there is a need for a section of law within the Sweden Dog Ordinance that would allow the Dog Control Officer to issue appearance tickets to the owners of such "dangerous dogs".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- <u>Sec. 1.</u> That the Town Board of the Town of Sweden shall hold a public hearing at the Sweden Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York, on the 10th day of May, 2005, at 7:15 PM to hear all persons for or against the adoption of Local Law No. 1, 2005 – Amendment to the Town of Sweden Dog Ordinance.
- Sec. 2. That the text of Local Law No. 1, 2005, is as follows:

"Section 84-3. Definitions:

DANGEROUS DOG – In addition to the definitions set forth in Section 108, Subdivision 24, of the Agriculture and Markets Law, a dog shall be considered a dangerous dog and subject to the provisions of Section 121, Subdivision 3 et seq. of the Agriculture and Markets Law if such dog, without justification, attacks a dog or cat and causes physical injury or death to such dog or cat.

Section 84-5. Penalties for offenses:

The addition of the words: 'Nothing contained in this section is intended to eliminate, reduce, diminish or replace the provisions set forth in Section 121 of the Agriculture and Markets Law with respect to fines, civil penalties or imprisonment with respect to dangerous dog violations.'

- Sec. 3. That the Town Clerk is authorized and directed to cause a notice of this hearing to be published in the official newspaper of the Town, in accordance with Section 265 of Town Law.
- <u>Sec. 4.</u> That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

Mr. Lester wanted to share a letter received from Larry Sherman from the NYS Department of Transportation regarding the speed limit between 580 East Avenue and Sweden Walker Road. The DOT does not feel it is warranted to reduce the speed limit in that area.

Councilperson Carges made a motion that was seconded by Councilperson Windus-Cook to change the status of civil service classification of Anna Dolby and Jessica Grossman to Student Helper. All voted in favor of the motion – four ayes. Motion adopted.
