A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Sweden was held at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York, on Tuesday, September 9, 2003.

Town Board Members present were Supervisor Nat O. Lester III, Councilperson Rob Carges, Councilperson Patricia Connors, Councilperson Carl Wheat, and Councilperson Danielle Windus-Cook. Also present were Director of Finance Leisa Strabel, Superintendent of Highways Fred Perrine, Assessor Alan Bader, Recreation Director Jim Nealon, Recreation Leader Jason Rhodes, and Deputy Town Clerk Marleen Cain.

Visitors present were Jim Hamlin from 50 Park Avenue, Julie and Frank Lapinski from 4016 Sweden Walker Road, and Thomas Ferris from 82 Erie Street.

Supervisor Lester called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. and asked everyone present to say the Pledge to the Flag. Supervisor Lester introduced Recreation Director Jim Nealon. Mr. Nealon stated that they would like to have two part time clerks at the center instead of three but they are still working on scheduling and coverage. He introduced Recreation Leader Jason Rhodes who explained that he has been organizing several sports leagues that have been successful and he will be continuing and adding to them. He also assisted at the Summer Camp. He is planning a haunted hayride for October 24 and 25 from 5:30 to 9:00 p.m. and he asked for volunteers. He will also be continuing instructional sport programs.

Mr. Nealon informed the Town Board that a new requirement has been set for RPAC members to volunteer for at least one special event each year. He handed out packets outlining revenue and expenses for each season since the grand opening of the Community Center. They will be reviewing and improving on what worked and changing what did not. They will be reorganizing the swim program to make better use of the pool time, lifeguards and instructors.

Councilperson Windus-Cook asked how Sweden's programs compare to other programs in regard to cost. Sweden's programs are in line with fees or cheaper.

Town Attorney Jim Bell arrived at 7:55 p.m.

Councilperson Carges offered an apology in regard to the current RecReader. They were printed and at Brockport Enterprises over 10 days ago but since then they have moved and that has delayed the distribution of the program. They should be at the Post Office this week. Mr. Nealon stated that about 75% of the programs have been pushed back a week. Mr. Carges gave permission for Mr. Nealon to investigate the cost of going to someone else for at least this one issue, if not for all. There hasn't been a problem in getting the other issues out.

Installation of the lights in the parking lot started today. The grand opening of the skate park will be this Saturday, September 13, 2003, at 1:00 p.m. Councilperson Windus-Cook asked about the park gate getting locked at night. There are two staff members at the Community Center at night and if one has to go to the park that would leave the other alone in the Center. The Board will discuss this at their next work session and in the meantime, Town Board members will sign up to do it. Supervisor Lester thanked Mr. Nealon and Mr. Rhodes for coming in.

Approval of the minutes for August 26, 2003, will take place at the next Board meeting.

Assessor Alan Bader reported that ground has been broken for a Tim Hortons. There have been two small claims regarding assessments with one being cleared in the Town's favor.

Superintendent of Highways Fred Perrine reported that the Hollybrook Road project should be done by the end of next week. A contractor will be installing the remaining concrete gutters on Monday and Sweden Lane will be paved on Monday and Tuesday. The next major project is the county project on Sweden Walker Road. Miscellaneous work is being done at the park including the installation of the BMX track.
