A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Sweden was held at the Town Hall, 18 State Street, Brockport, New York, on Tuesday, July 28, 2020.

Town Board Members present were Supervisor Kevin G. Johnson, Councilperson Robert Muesebeck, Councilperson Patricia Hayles, Councilperson Randall Hoke, and Councilperson Rhonda Humby. Also present were Finance Director Leisa Strabel, Superintendent of Highways Brian Ingraham, Town Attorney Jim Bell, Building Inspector Lyle Stirk, and Town Clerk Karen Sweeting.

Visitors present were Chris Hamlin and Karen LoBracco.

Supervisor Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and asked everyone present to say the Pledge to the Flag and remain standing for a moment of silence to remember our first responders, the men and women fighting for our freedoms and those affected by COVID and their families.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Supervisor Johnson opened all eight (8) scheduled public hearings and asked if anyone had any comments.

Town Attorney Jim Bell explained that he, Building Inspector Lyle Stirk and Fire Marshal Michael Vergari went back and forth on changing the definitions to add the concepts of Airbnb and VRBO. Mr. Bell also changed the definition of signs in Chapter 175-30 Section 5 – simplifying it.

Supervisor Johnson felt the definition of lodging house is troublesome and any changes would be difficult. Town Attorney Jim Bell said the intent is to identify any Airbnb or VRBO properties, so the Town has knowledge of them. He could expand the enforcement component. Noise, maintenance, and large gatherings are all covered by other sections of the code. Building Inspector Lyle Stirk prefers that enforcement language not be added to this section. Supervisor Johnson asked Mr. Bell if there are any statutes or case law that allow a Town to restrict the use of rental property within that Town. Mr. Bell answered no. Supervisor Johnson said that all we are doing is requiring a list of all Airbnb and VRBO located in the Town. Discussion.

No other comments.

Written comments were received from John and Sandra Cassin and are on file in the Town Clerk's office.

The public hearing was closed at 6:11 p.m.

REPORTS OF DEPARTMENTS AND BOARD MEMBERS:

Councilperson Hoke reported options to IT service contracts and VOIP phone service providers. Still looking into ways to cut costs in the Court.

Councilperson Humby reported nothing new with Sweden Farmers Museum or the cemeteries. Mowing continues with the recent rain at the cemetery. Dog Control - two dogs are being boarded by the Town of Ogden pending litigation.

Councilperson Muesebeck reported that Buildings and Grounds clean up around the Splash Pad and playgrounds daily. The Dog Park pond has been emptied and disinfected. Baseball continues with social distancing. Roger Evans has been busy with repairs and they are painting the fence around Nietopski Field. Mowing continues with recent rain.

Councilperson Hayles thanked everyone for their condolences on the passing of her mother. She feels very lucky to have many invaluable resources in our community – Strong West, Monroe Ambulance. Mrs. Hayles reported that things are moving along at the SCCC. There is a modified summer program that is going very well. The abstract contains several refund checks for programs and Lodge rentals due to COVID. Mrs. Hayles reported on the year-to-date payroll through July 17, 2020 comparing with last year – down almost 28% due to staff management.

Councilperson Hayles shared reports for the Seymour Library. Clarkson representative, Pat Galinski, provided a summary of the meeting. The Sweden representatives of the Library Board made minor revisions to the MOU draft. Mrs. Hayles noted the dates need to be reversed. The library reopened to the public on July 20th with COVID compliance – limited number of hours. The Finance Committee is beginning their budget process. Discussion. Mrs. Hayles asked Town Attorney Jim Bell for an update on the return of funds from the foundation to the library.

Supervisor Johnson attended a preconstruction meeting on the sidewalk project – three areas, Owens Road, Holley Street, Persistence Path/Isla Way. Persistence Path portion will be last, still negotiating with McLean and their proposed development in that area. Holley Street portion has started.

Supervisor Johnson participated in a teleconference with Councilperson Hayles and the Sweden representatives of the Library Board. Mr. Johnson announced a bike share program interest for our community – centralizing around the SUNY Brockport campus, looking to launch next year.

Supervisor Johnson spoke with NYS DOT Regional Director Kevin Bush, members of NYS DOT, and our Town Engineer to discuss the proposed Gary Drive extension project. The project is feasible and funding is available. The next step is to see if the residents want it. Mr. Johnson would like to combine this project with NYS DOT proposed road improvements to Route 31 – turning lanes and signal improvements. The Public Information Meeting pertaining to this project is August 18, 2020 at 7 p.m. at the SCCC.

Supervisor Johnson asked Councilperson Muesebeck and Hayles to pass along compliments to department staff for all their extra hard work through this baseball season – scheduling, cleaning, and making sure that social distancing is followed.

Supervisor Johnson explained that the Board has undergone a difficult process of looking at significant budget cuts – including staff cuts, which are difficult. The Board has either cut, reduced, or furloughed twenty-three (23) positions out of 70 total positions. Mr. Johnson stated that we are on track for keeping our financial position sound.

Town Attorney James Bell reported receiving two (2) tax assessment challenges – one residential, one commercial. Supervisor Johnson asked if a commencement date should be included in the library MOU. Discussion.

Building Inspector Lyle Stirk reported several commercial projects that David Strabel will be inspecting. Permit application requests have been down due to COVID but are now increasing. The department drafted a letter explaining why the department will not be addressing Chapter 55 Assemblies, Public requests – due to Governor's Order limiting size of gatherings.

Superintendent of Highways Brian Ingraham reported County Road work on Gordon Road and Reed Road. Assisted the Town of Parma with a paving project and have been working on drainage issues.

Finance Director Leisa Strabel reported that Chase Bank will not be opening in Brockport until mid-August which causes issues with the Tax Department. Mrs. Strabel is looking into other banking options. The old Dog Control truck was sold at auction for \$11,700.
