RESOLUTION NO. 25

Authorizing Home Rule Request to NYS Legislature Seeking Enactment of an Assembly and Senate Bill for Special Law

WHEREAS, Assemblyman William D. Reilich and Senator George Maziarz have proposed that the State Assembly enact Home Rule Legislation at the State Level, allowing the Town of Sweden within the County of Monroe to establish 25 mile per hour area speed limits within various portions of the town as determined by the Town Board from time to time; and
